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## Research Interests

My research, broadly speaking, focuses on theories of syntax, prosody, and their interfaces. More specifically, I primarily pursue two intersecting research programs: one on the syntax of argument structure as it relates to binding/reflexivity, and another on the formal properties of intonation and its interfaces with structure, meaning, and acoustics.

I have explored these research programs with investigations into the forms of English reflexive nominals, phrasal/focal stress patterns, argument realization, the meaning of intonational contours, polar question intonation, case and fine structure in the nominal domain, and Japanese linguistics.

Some of my recent research topics include:

- Morphosyntax of reflexive clauses, reflexive anaphors, and pronouns
- Modelling interactions of intonation/prosody with syntax, morphology, and semantics
- English intonation and the phonetics-phonology interface
- The syntactic position of internal arguments
- Phrasal stress and the syntax-phonology interface
- The syntactic properties of VoiceP and its relationship with grammatical voice
